Further considerations in head injury management Pain management. appropriate attention should be given to pain relief. Anti-emetic therapy. Control of nausea and vomiting following a head injury with anti-emetic use (Ondansetron) should be strongly considered when the decision to CT scan has already been made.

Important Nursing Management of Head Injury Patient

Head trauma occurs commonly in childhood. Most head trauma in children is minor and not associated with brain injury or long-term sequelae. However, a small number of children who appear to be at low risk may have a clinically important traumatic brain (ciTBI) injury.

This guideline covers the assessment and early management of head injury in children, young people and adults. It promotes effective clinical assessment so that people receive the right care for the severity of their head injury, including referral directly to specialist care if needed.

Minor Head Trauma Assessment Management

For patients ≥ 16 years, within 24hrs of a suspected closed head injury and a GCS of 13-15, commence Abbreviated Westmead Post Traumatic Amnesia Scale (A-WPTAS) assessment. Additional History. Establish mechanism of injury. How injury was sustained. Date and time of injury. First aid / NSW ambulance treatment prior to arrival. Management ...

Minor head trauma in infants and children: Management ...

Signs of a penetrating injury or visible trauma to the scalp or skull — in children under 1 year of age, a bruise, swelling, or laceration of more than 5 cm on the head. Suspected cervical spine injury — full cervical spine immobilization should be arranged before transfer to the hospital. Concern about the diagnosis of head injury.
