Wound care practices for neonatal and pediatric patients, including the choice of specific dressings or other wound care products, are currently based on a combination of provider experience and preference and a small number of published clinical guidelines based on expert opinion; rigorous evidence-based clinical guidelines for wound management in these populations is lacking.

Most wound care products are developed in research studies conducted in adults, and the wound care practitioner usually has to adapt adult products when treating wounds in children. Care should always be taken to review the list of ingredients

in all products to identify known irritants such as lanolin, balsam of Peru, alcohol, dyes, and fragrances.

Pediatric patients generally have skin that is more fragile than an adult's, and many of their systems are immature, which can complicate wound care. Thorough assessment, including pain and anxiety levels, is essential, bearing in mind the many pediatric risk factors in wound care, and treatment must be tailored to the needs of this special population.

Dressings and Products in Pediatric Wound Care.
